



New Tales of China's Dinosaurs

China has quietly become the global epicenter of fossil-hunting. In the 1990s, a farmer found the world's very first clearly feathered dinosaur. Scientists called it Sinosauropteryx, which means "the China dragon bird". Since then, more than 40 dinosaur species have been found in the province of Liaoning, including more than 24 pterosaurs – winged reptiles. Recently a new species of titanosaur was found in Jiangxi. Because China is less well-explored by paleontologists, there's much excitement about what will be found next—and what amazing stories the ancient fossils will tell!
