For decades, a few hundred miles northeast of Beijing, the Yixian Formation has offered up a treasure trove of exquisite dinosaur fossils dating back to the early Cretaceous about 145 to 66 million years ago.

Dinosaur fossils have been found on all seven continents. All non-avian dinosaurs went extinct about 66 million years ago. There are roughly 700 known species of extinct dinosaurs. Modern birds are a kind of dinosaur because they share a common ancestor with non-avian dinosaurs.

The reason is the diversity and great abundance of terrestrial plants and animals and their fossilization. At most sites only bone can be found. ALiaoning the fine particles of ash and mud that covered animals preserved soft body parts and prevented decomposition by sealing off oxygen The fossils, located in the city of Lufeng, Wuding County, and Shuangbai County of Chuxiong Yi Autonomous Prefecture, respectively, are buried shallowly and the shapes of the bones can be easily recognized, said Chen Jun, deputy director of the provincial department of natural resources,

Microraptor was among the smallest-known non-avian dinosaurs, with the holotype of M. gui measuring 77 centimetres (2.53 ft) in length, 88–94 centimetres (2.89– 3.08 ft) in wingspan and weighing 0.5–1.4 kilograms (1.1–3.1 lb).


